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PAYOUTS

Your bet wins if the value of your hand, made up of your three cards and of the two community cards, is equal to or higher than a pair of 10s. Winning bets are paid as follows:

HAND	PAYOUT*
*UP TO THE MAXIMUM INDICATED AT THE TABLE	
Royal flush	1,000 to 1
Straight flush	200 to 1
Four-of-a-kind	50 to 1
Full house	11 to 1
Flush	8 to 1
Straight	5 to 1
Three-of-a-kind	3 to 1
Two pair	2 to 1
Pair (10, J, Q, K, A)	1 to 1

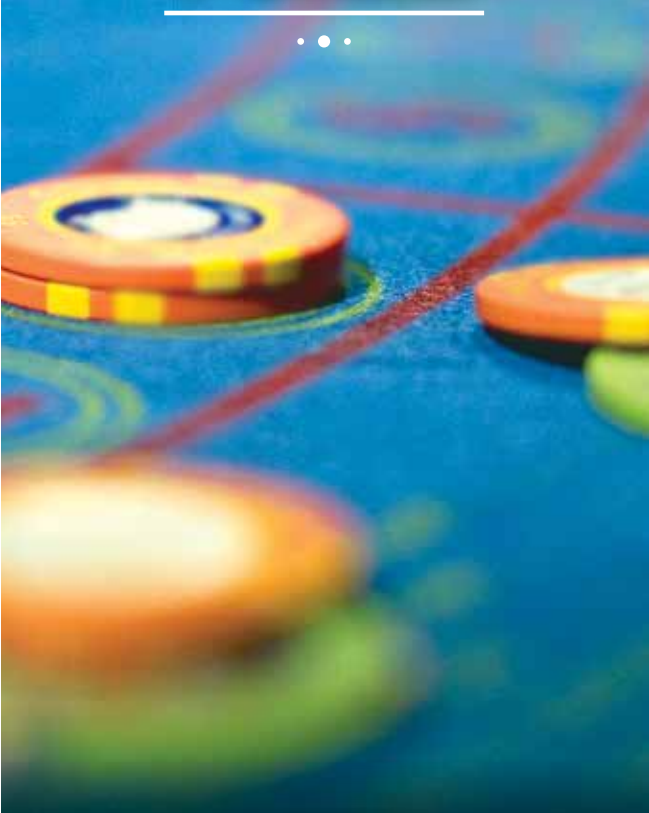
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LET IT RIDE POKER

WE'RE ALL PLAY

Grand Prix Poker, better known as Let It Ride Stud Poker, is an exciting game of strategy that is easy to learn.

THE OBJECT OF THE GAME

By combining a three-card hand and two of the dealer’s cards, attempt to obtain a five-card poker hand with a rank of a pair of 10s or higher.



THE CARDS

Grand Prix Poker (Let It Ride) is played with one standard deck of 52 cards. In decreasing order, the rank of the cards is as follows: Ace, King, Queen, Jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3 and 2. An Ace may be used to complete an Ace-2-3-4-5 straight or straight flush.

THE BETS

Using value chips purchased from the dealer, place three distinct bets of equal value. The bets must be placed on the designated areas on the layout before the dealer announces “Rien ne va plus” (No more bets!) and the cards are dealt. Bets must be made in accordance with the minimum and maximum limits indicated at the table. You are permitted to play only one hand per game.

THE DEAL

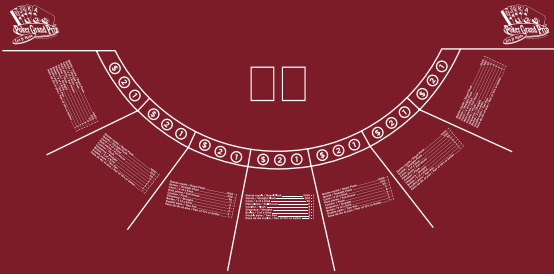
The dealer distributes three cards, face down, to each player in turn, and also deals himself three cards, face down. Two of the dealer’s three cards will serve as community cards, that is, all players will be using them to complete their five-card hand.

THE HANDS

After having examined your three cards, you have the option of letting your three bets ride or requesting that one or two of them be withdrawn, as indicated below. To withdraw a bet, you must signal your intention to the dealer by scratching the layout. You must not withdraw your bet yourself. You are not allowed to show your cards nor to discuss them with other players.

PLAYER’S OPTIONS

- . **1ST BET:** you have the option of letting your first bet ride or requesting that it be withdrawn without seeing any of the community cards. Once all players have acted on their first bet, the dealer discards one of his three cards and reveals one of the two remaining cards.
- . **2ND BET:** you have the option of letting your second bet ride or requesting that it be withdrawn after having seen the first community card. Once all players have acted on their second bet, the dealer reveals his second card.
- . **3RD BET:** you must let your third bet ride.



THE COMBINATIONS

The ranking of Grand Prix Poker combinations, in decreasing order, is as follows:

- . **ROYAL FLUSH:** Ace-King-Queen-Jack-10 of the same suit.
- . **STRAIGHT FLUSH:** five cards of the same suit in consecutive order.
- . **FOUR-OF-A-KIND:** four cards of the same rank.
- . **FULL HOUSE:** three-of-a-kind and a pair.
- . **FLUSH:** five cards of the same suit.
- . **STRAIGHT:** five cards in consecutive order, regardless of suit.
- . **THREE-OF-A-KIND:** three cards of the same rank.
- . **TWO PAIR:** two sets of two cards of the same rank.
- . **PAIR:** two cards of the same rank.
